



PASTOR'S REPORT

I finished last year's reports with these words: "I am looking forward to whatever God has in store for us in 2020." Famous last words indeed! Regardless of all that has happened in 2020 we know that God was not taken by surprise by any of it.

At the end of last year I felt that God was saying that this year would be a year of transition. I did not realise that in some senses it was a word for the whole world and not just our little church in Narrabri.



Last year ended with the drought in full swing with little sign of relief, but that changed with the heavy rain at the end of January and into February. As I write this, farmers all over the region are preparing for a great harvest of winter crops.

The end of last year saw me undergoing some serious health challenges for the first time in my life. I remember sitting like the old uncle on the edge of our family Christmas celebrations too weak to get excited about anything. By that stage, the doctors had determined I had an overactive thyroid which was removed in January. My recovery from that was delayed by severe allergic reactions to some unknown factor.



Also early in the year we lost the Tolsons and the Nashes who moved to Toowoomba. It was a great shock to lose these families who have been a part of New Life from the beginning.

Then there was Covid, which has been the defining event for the whole world in 2020. Whole industries have come crashing down and economies have been restructured. As the world has been numbed by the events of this year, we know that God is still in control and is using this disease to turn people to Him.

Because of Government regulations, we had to shut down our Sunday worship services for two months from April 5th to May 31st inclusive (Palm

Sunday to Pentecost). We discovered the world of Hangouts, Zoom and other technological ways of meeting. Cell groups were able to meet for much of this time, with technology helping us through the worst of it.

What did I learn from the shutdown? Technology, no matter how good, is a poor substitute for being together in person. Also God is bigger than a virus and bigger than any Government restriction on worship.

So now we are meeting as normal with a few changes to our practices. We use prepackaged food for morning tea, spread out our seating, encourage hand washing, and modify our Communion practice.



We have not had Messy Church this year nor Family Camp, and I think these have been a big loss in the way that we experience community together. I hope that it will not be too long before we can “safely” do Messy Church and I hope we might do Family Camp early next year.

After taking a bit of a battering earlier in the year, I think Cell Groups are coming back. I have handed on leadership of the Wednesday group to Grant and started a new Family Cell group that meets on Saturday afternoons. That has been a learning curve! For anyone serious about following Jesus, cell groups are the best way of growing in spiritual maturity. It’s not just about getting the inspiring messages on a Sunday morning, but about sharing our lives together, learning to pray for one another and applying the gospel to daily life.

Another factor brought in as a result of Covid is that we have not had the opportunity to have visiting speakers or go to conferences in the way we normally would. This can result in a feeling of isolation from the world wide church. I hope this changes next year! I have participated in a few online interactive seminars and webinars and really they are just not the same.

So let’s pray that 2021 is different to 2020 in a good way. Regardless of what happens now or in the future, the key is to remember that God is in control and to find our hope in Him.

NEW LIFE FUTURES

Last year, I shared with you the dream that I have for this church. This dream has been carefully developed over a period of several months in 2019. We worked hard to develop a statement that incorporated the values and the prophetic words that form the DNA of the church.

- Cell church- we are a church made up of small groups, not a church that has them as an “extra.”
- Experiential faith- we want to experience God as reality not as theory, the Holy Spirit encountering us in worship and equipping us for mission.
- Apostolic- we will remain in relationship with apostolic leaders, receiving grace for community through the spirit of sonship.
- Inclusive- everyone is welcome regardless of social status, education or work.
- Christian unity- respecting, loving and working with other congregations to demonstrate the love of Christ in our town.
- Practical care for one another

This long term vision has to be chunked down to shorter term goals of three years and then annual.

The disruption brought by Covid may have slowed down any momentum we may have had, but I have achieved one of my goals in 2020 which is to emphasise the work of the Holy Spirit and to teach about the spirit realm more generally. It hasn't just been about sermons, though, as these topics have been followed up through cell groups.

We have also taken a step forward in the long term goal by moving Prayer Weekends to a 6 weekly basis, which is a step forward to moving to monthly Prayer Weekends.

A Dream For New Life

I see a church in Narrabri where people in their hundreds come to find water in the desert of their lives. The presence of God refreshes their spirits and the love of God's people brings hope to refresh their hearts.

I see a church in Narrabri that gathers weekly in homes and other places around the town and beyond. I see a church with a hundred cells meeting each day as lighthouses, shining Jesus' love in each street and neighbourhood. Our cell groups will be places of friendship, encouragement, evangelism and growth in our knowledge of God.

I see a church in Narrabri that brings together the diversity of cell groups and shows each person that they belong to something bigger. Each week we will celebrate what God is doing in our community. We will worship together and we will learn together.

I see a church in Narrabri where God's presence is experienced in every meeting, whether a cell group or a Sunday celebration. When we meet we will pursue the power and grace of the Holy Spirit and allow Jesus to transform us. As He changes us, we will find grace to take Him to our friends and neighbours. Encounters with the living God will ripple out across the Shire of Narrabri as we live in God's presence every day.

I see a church in Narrabri where anyone can become all they were created to be. We have been called to restore those who are broken, to walk with those who are lonely, to heal those who are wounded, to accept those who are rejected. We will be a community where every person has a chance to receive the healing grace of Jesus. We will be a community where every believer has the chance to be a pipeline for the healing grace of Jesus. We recognise that a true community finds ways of practical, emotional and spiritual support for its members as they are lifted from brokenness.

I see a church in Narrabri that sends evangelists, pastors, teachers and missionaries. We will equip those who belong to the church to go beyond the church. We will send them out to take God's grace to the region, the nation, the world.

I see a church in Narrabri that makes it easy to belong, to be healed, to believe, and to grow.
